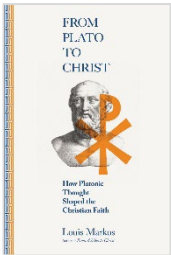

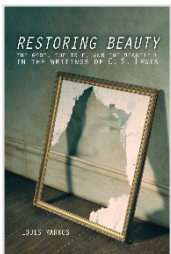

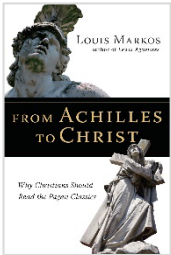
From Plato to Christ: How Platonic Thought Shaped the Christian Faith
